Local Transportation

From Växjö Central or Växjö Småland Airport, buses and taxis offer easy access to Linnaeus University.



By bicycle

In case you prefer a bicycle, many hotels can offer this. It takes roughly 20 minutes with a bicycle from the city centre to Linnaeus University's campus.



By Bus

To Linnaeus University from Växjö Central, take bus 3 ("Universitetet"). Buy tickets on the bus with a card, or get a 10% discount using the "Länstrafiken Kronoberg" app (card payment).

Most taxi companies start from the train station at **Södra Bantorget at World Trade Centre**, which means you can find available taxis there.

Electricity

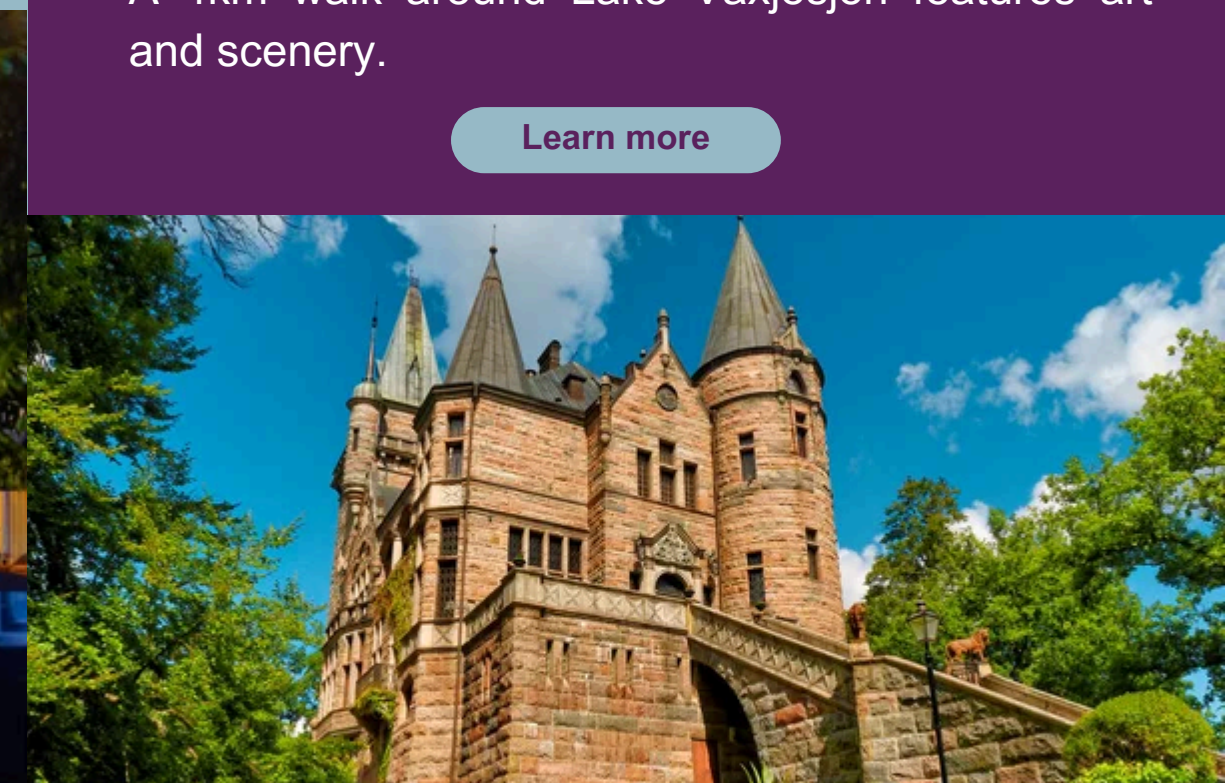
